Subject: CCRTA Bourne Town Report

The Cape Cod Regional Transit Authority (CCRTA) has provided a total of 22,779 one-way passenger trips across all services in the town of Bourne from July 2024 through June 2025 (FY25).

CCRTA provided 430 ADA trips for Bourne residents. CCRTA also provided 62 Bourne residents with 254 trips to Boston area hospitals through the Boston Hospital Transportation service.

CCRTA provided 177 Bourne residents with 3,649 DART (Dial-a-Ride Transportation) trips during FY25. Total DART passenger trips in the fifteen towns of Cape Cod were 115,283 in FY25. CCRTA's ride-hail service, SmartDART, provided 402 trips for Bourne residents.

The fixed route Bourne Run serves the towns of Bourne, Falmouth and Mashpee. A total of 10,384 one-way trips originated in Bourne for the Bourne Run for the period July 2024 through June 2025. Total ridership for the Bourne Run for this period was 22,066.

The fixed route Sandwich Line serves the towns of Bourne, Barnstable and Sandwich via Route 6A, Route 130, Quaker Meeting House Rd, Race Ln., and West Main St. A total of 7,210 one-way trips originated in Bourne for the Sandwich Line for the period July 2024 through June 2025. Total ridership for the Sandwich Line for this period was 31,088.

CCRTA also operates the CapeFLYER, a seasonal rail connection between Boston and Cape Cod, with two stations in Bourne 284 riders boarded and 453 riders alighted the CapeFLYER train at the Buzzards Bay station, and 1,174 riders boarded and 1,728 riders alighted the CapeFLYER train at the Bourne Bridge for the 2025 season. Total ridership for the CapeFLYER in 2025 was 14,944 compared to 13,588 in 2024.

CCRTA supplied the Bourne Council on Aging with two Mobility Assistance Program (MAP) vehicles that provided 2,062 rides from July 2024 to June 2025.
